Gifted children love opportunities to play with language. In your explorations, you will find it easier to connect with your high IQ students if you can add in some component of wordplay, even starting with introductions to new words. Consider using jokes, puns, song lyrics, poems, and figurative language as you put forth the new terms.

### **Teaching Vocabulary to Gifted and Advanced Learners ...**

Figurative language: a technique poets (and others) use to create strong imagery. Figurative language conveys meaning beyond the literal meaning of the words. Simile: a type of figurative language in which two seemingly unlike things are compared using like or as. Payday loans are like a blight on one's financial soul.

Figurative Language Definition. Figurative language uses figures of speech to be more effective, persuasive, and impactful. Figures of speech such as metaphors, similes, and allusions go beyond the literal meanings of the words to give readers new insights. On the other hand, alliterations, imageries, or onomatopoeias are figurative devices that appeal to the senses of the readers.
