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The objective of this exercise is to identify the areas where improvement can be made in the study and also understand the limitations of an empirical research study. The Research Methodology Critical Analysis report is also aiming to provide an explanation for the weaknesses which has been identified in the empirical study. In this report the emphasis of the researcher is not on judging the quality of the study but to highlight only those points which has a scope for improvement and changes.

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At the heart of critical social research is the idea that knowledge is structured by existing sets of social relations. The aim of a critical methodology is to provide knowledge which engages the prevailing social structures. These social structures are seen by critical researchers, in one way or another, as oppressive structures.
